Summertime should be a fun and exciting time for kids. Grace Point has planned nine awesome weeks for the boys and girls in your life that will make their summer days the greatest of the year. CAMP PRICES

All campers must pay a one-time non-refundable registration of \$35.00. The fee is due upon completion of the registration packet.

OPTION #1 – Weekly Options

If your child plans on attending each week of camp, the cost per week per camper is \$95.00 and \$90.00 a week for each additional child. The fee is due each Monday of the new week of camp. A full week of camp is considered 3-5 days.

OPTION #2- Single Day Option

If your child plans to attend only a single day of the week the cost per day is \$20.00 with no more than 2 days a week. The fee is due the day the child attends camp. This will be on a first come, first serve basis. Must be scheduled ahead of time.

Drop Off Times

Campers may begin arriving at 7:00 a.m. Camp activities start at 8:00 a.m.

Pick Up Times

All campers must be picked by 6:00 p.m. After 6:00 p.m. you will be charged a fee of \$1.00 per child for every minute late. This fee to be paid upon pick up of your child.

These fees pay our employees for the time they had to stay after their shift ended. Campers who do not pay the late fees will not be permitted back to camp. Please communicate this information to anyone picking up your child.

Pick Up and Drop Off Procedure

Parents or Guardians must leave their vehicle to pick up and drop off their child.

Campers must be signed in upon arrival. To pick the camper up you must have a Camp Grace Point Pick-up Pass. We realize that to some this may seem like an inconvenience, especially if you have been here before and “we know you”, but we have a big commitment to the safety of our kids, and we want to honor that through these policies. If you do not have a pick-up pass please be ready to show I.D. so we may check the list of authorized people for the child. If someone else is picking up your child, you must let us know ahead of time by calling the office at 334-514-9292. Include your campers name, who will be picking up your child and a contact number. If we have this documented, they may pick your child up. If you need an additional pass for other people picking up your child, you may get those as well.

SNACKS & FOOD

Lunch is not provided so each camper is responsible for bringing their own lunch and snack. However, there will be certain days where Camp Grace Point will provide lunch. We will let you know these days ahead of time.

BEHAVIOR AT CAMP

Participation in the camp is a privilege, not a right. In order to participate in camp, children must be able to successfully function in a large-group, community setting. While all children make mistakes while growing up, for the safety of our campers we cannot accommodate children who do not or will not properly relate to authority, show respect for other campers/staff or submit themselves to camp rules and policies. If the behavior of a camper requires administration to call a parent, the child will be allowed to come back the next day with the understanding that if their behavior cannot improve, they will be sent home for the remainder of the day. After a day they will be allowed to come back, and if again their behavior has not been corrected, they will be asked not to return, and a refund will be given for the remainder of any following paid weeks.

What to Bring and Wear

Send your child to camp in comfortable clothes appropriate for the weather. No sandal, open-toed, or high heeled shoes are allowed. Sneakers/tennis shoes only. Some activities will get messy, so older clothes are recommended. On days we have water activities the campers will need to bring a bathing suit, a towel, and a change of clothes. Since we will be spending time outside every day, parents will be responsible for putting sunscreen on before coming to camp.

Sunscreen is not provided by camp and cannot be applied by the staff.

On most Fridays we will have a costume contest that goes along with the theme that week. Campers are not required to participate, but it is a lot of fun and we hand out prizes. If they do participate, they will need to bring a change of clothes that day. Please make sure that anything your child brings to camp is labeled clearly with their name on it. Kids lose things and we can more than easily help them so long as they have their names written on their stuff. With all the things that need to be brought in it is also very helpful to send it a backpack with their name labeled. These will be kept in their team rooms.

What not to Bring

We strongly encourage campers not to bring cell-phones, iPads, iPods, Nintendo DS and other handheld electronics. Many times, it can get lost or broken and it makes life a lot easier if they don't bring them in. We recognize that today's kids are part of the most connected generation ever, some having had cell-phones and mobile gaming devices since grade school. **If campers do choose to bring electronics, they must be kept in their backpacks at times.** We will have times some days where it will be permitted to use them. Please know that we are not responsible for items that are taken to camp and are lost/stolen/broken. If you ever need to get in touch with a camper immediately, we recommend calling the front desk at (334)-514-9292 and we will be happy to get in touch with your camper right away. **We will do whatever we can to help your kids protect their belongings, but please know that if your child brings something to camp it is their responsibility to keep up with it.** It is always best to leave things of great value at home.

We assure you, we have plenty of fun scheduled.

Camp Sickness or Injured Procedure Policy

Illness

Please do not send your child to camp with a fever and/or ailment that would hinder their participation and jeopardize the well-being of other campers. The camper will be removed from the activity and the staff will call the parent/guardian or emergency contact for the camper to be picked up within one hour of notification.

Hospital, Urgent Care, or Ambulance Service

In the event of an emergency in which staff warrants that the child is taken to the nearest hospital, transport fees and hospital fees will be the responsibility of the parents or legal guardian.

Lost and Found

We will have a lost and found at the front desk. Please label everything your child sends to camp. Do not send expensive equipment to camp. **We are not responsible for the loss or damage of any items that your child may bring to camp.** Please check with staff immediately upon noticing the loss of any item(s).
